A programme can be scheduled between the teacher and the student and homework may also be given to ensure that the student gets as much practice as possible.

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

The IELTS exam is one of the most widely accepted language qualifications at universities in English-speaking countries. Most institutions require a minimum score of 6.0 or 6.5, and our IELTS Preparation Course aims to ensure you reach the standards for your chosen institution.

Our IELTS programme will work on your reading, writing, speaking and listening skills, focusing on all specific tasks that you will be required to complete in the IELTS exam. You will also become familiar with the exam's format and structure.

Our classes will help you build your confidence through continuous practice of all exam-specific tasks, preparing you to complete them in the given timeframe. We also offer regular designated exam practice days, after which you will receive detailed, tailored feedback on your performance and progress.

In addition, we will keep track of your scores in order to recognise your strengths and identify areas that need further development.

Please note that an advanced level of English (CEFR B2/C1 or equivalent) is required to join this programme.



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
